BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS: QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Bloodborne pathogens must find a direct route of entry into the body for infection to be possible. The infected blood or bodily fluid must enter the body through breaks in the skin, such as cuts, burns or other breaks caused by dermatitis, acne or skin rash. Bodily fluids can also splash into the eyes and cause infection.
