

Il Libro Dei Morti Tibetano Bardo Th Dol

La tradizione Tibetana ci ha lasciato questo testo antichissimo che ha lo scopo sia di prepararci durante la vita al nostro viaggio ultraterreno, sia di permetterci di accompagnare praticamente i nostri cari al momento del passaggio nell'Al di Là, o Stato Intermedio, cioè quella parte di esistenza che è compresa tra la morte e la rinascita. Lo scopo del testo, come si vedrà leggendolo, è quello di portare lo spirito del defunto allo stato di Illuminato e condurlo così fuori dal ciclo di morte e rinascita nel quale sono intrappolati tutti gli esseri viventi.

Il libro tibetano dei morti (Bardo Todol) è conosciuto come Libro dei morti del Tibet così come il Per-Em-Rà è noto come Libro dei morti dell'antico Egitto. La parola Bardo significa morte, trapasso. La parola Todol significa liberazione. Infatti questo poema simbolico tibetano, in lingua sanscrita, parla di una tecnica iniziatica per compiere un viaggio interiore e giungere alla liberazione dalla paura della morte. Malgrado la denominazione, quest'opera è scritta per i vivi e non per i morti.

Il Bardo Thodol noto nei paesi occidentali come Libro tibetano dei morti, è un testo classico del Buddismo tibetano. Nella tradizione il Bardo Thodol viene recitato presso il corpo del morto (o del morente) in un periodo di tempo dopo la morte in cui si ritiene che possa ancora essere ricettivo, per rammentare la dottrina del vuoto ed aiutarne lo "spirito" ad evitare il ciclo di rinascita. Nel libro si ripercorrono tre fasi nelle quali progressivamente ed in seguito al possibile fallimento nella fase che precede. 1) si cerca di favorire lo scioglimento dello spirito nel nirvana. 2) si aiuta ad identificare lo spirito con le "divinità" del piano di coesistenza intermedio tra l'ingresso nel nirvana e la ricaduta nel ciclo di rinascite. Di tale piano sono caratteristici i Cinque Buddha spesso raffigurati nei Mandala. 3) si tenta di evitare la ricaduta nel ciclo di rinascite.
